Discussion with others: Computer science, nursing

Rationale: The ICD-10-PCS coding system was instituted October 1, 2015. ICD-10-PCS is a significant change from the ICD-9 system which was a listing of codes. ICD-10-PCS requires a 7 alphanumeric code be built with specific rules applied to each digit of the code. This requires knowledge of anatomy, surgical approaches and medical devices. We have been teaching ICD-10-PCS as part of Coding Procedures 1 but there is too much content for one course with the new procedural coding system. With ICD-9, there were approximately 3,000 procedure codes in the listing. With ICD-10-PCS up to 87,000 codes can be built. The new system is required by all payers and is used throughout the U.S.A.
