<u>Rationale</u>: This course will primarily serve as a Restricted Elective for undergraduate Management majors (9 hours are required), however, it will be open to any CBA undergraduate major. Since the catalog language indicates any MAN course will satisfy the Restricted Elective requirement, branding this course as a MAN course rather than a QMB course will remove a lot of confusion on the part of students, and will eliminate the need for audit corrections for Management students who have taken this course. Prerequisite language needs to be changed to reflect the new standards for admission to an undergraduate major (successful completion of the primary core).

The impetus to reduce the number of students in the department majors, increase their quality, increase the rigor of the courses, and increase the focus on data driven decision making has been the driving force behind this proposal. The course will cover a variety of rigorous decision support models from within the realm of mathematical programming (i.e., linear, integer, zero/one, and goal programming), dynamic programming, network models, queuing models, decision theory, and decision trees. It will examine the processes, methodologies, infrastructure, and current practices used to transform data from many sources into useful information for managerial decision making.
